- Students and parents should regularly check teachers' *Week-at-a-Glance* to view plans for past/present classroom activities. We also recommend keeping an agenda book.

Office 365 and OneNote

- ➤ River Dell utilizes the Microsoft Office suite of software programs including PowerPoint, Word, Excel, Teams, Forms, OneNote and more!
- ➤ Parents will have limited access to OneNote where they may find additional teacher information.
- Teachers and students will use OneNote (an interactive and collaborative online notebook) in school. Parents will need their student's username/password information to access this site.

One-to-One Laptop Initiative

- > School-issued laptops will be distributed to all students prior to the start of school. More information to follow as the school year approaches.
- RDMS will hold an optional Summer Technology Academy in August where students will receive their laptop and become acclimated with the technologies used at RDMS. More information to be discussed later in this presentation.
- Laptops should be brought home to use; Students are responsible for charging them nightly.

- Marching band is a graded elective for <u>students in grades 8-12</u> that occurs during **after school hours**. It includes instrumentalists, color guard, and managers.
- > Select 7th grade instrumentalists will be accepted by <u>audition only</u>, <u>based on instrument openings</u>. Audition dates to be determined.
- > Events include playing at HS football games, band festivals and field trips/parades.

6th Grade → 7th Grade Scheduling



MIDDLE SCHOOL MATH

7th Grade

All students will have a core math class that meets every day and a Math Workshop class which meets two out of every four days. The core class & workshop class are both leveled.

Levels

- Math 7 & Math 7 Workshop: Grade level course that leads to PreAlgebra 8 in 8th grade.
- PreAlgebra 7 & PreAlgebra 7 Workshop: Accelerated math course in which both 7th & 8th grade math content will be taught leading to Algebra 1 in 8th grade.

MIDDLE SCHOOL MATH

8th Grade

Students will have only one period of math in their schedule.

Levels

- **PreAlgebra 8**: Grade level course that leads to Algebra 1 in 9th grade.
- Accelerated Algebra 1: High school Algebra 1 content. PreAlgebra 7 is a prerequisite.
- **Honors Algebra 1**: Honors level of the Accelerated Algebra 1 curriculum. PreAlgebra 7 is a prerequisite.

Placement in PreAlgebra

- > If students scored Level 5 on the NJSLA Math 5, the student is placed in PreAlgebra 7.
- > If not Level 5, students who satisfy both criteria below are placed in PreAlgebra 7.
 - > 6th Grade Math Class Test Avg ≥ 90%
 - ➤ LinkIt Form B Test Score ≥ 80%

> Otherwise, students are placed in Math 7.

NJ State Assessments

7th Grade: 7th grade students take two state

tests: NJSLA ELA 7 & NJSLA Math 7.

8th Grade: 8th grade students take three state tests: NJSLA ELA 8, NJSLA Science 8, & an NJSLA math test.

 - Writing a Narrative Part of Realistic Fiction
 - Descriptive Writing Part of the Science Fiction Genre Study
 - Persuasive Reading and Writing Part of Non-Fiction
 - Integrate poetry as companion pieces
- Literature and informational (nonfiction) text are important

- Background knowledge and motivation are critical when learning to read and when accessing complex text
- Research provides the opportunity to learn more about a subject and provides the opportunity to look beyond research to questions left unanswered
- ➤ Using evidence remains a critical skill, allowing students to ground their thinking in the work of authors and experts in literature and in the content areas

STEM

- > <u>STEM is taken in 8th grade only</u>: Two courses, each a half year in length
- STEM Computers: Focus on computer science and programming skills which will cover the following topics: data and analysis, algorithms and programming, and computing systems.
- > STEM Engineering: Focus on technology design thinking skills and concepts which include technological and engineering literacy. The new framework design, detailed previously, includes engineering design, ethics and culture, and the effects of technology on the natural world among the disciplinary concepts.
